






The problem

According to Water Framework
Directive (the Government's national
river health check) the River Avon area
has a 'moderate' overall status,
meaning it is failing to meet health
targets.

Some parts of the Rivers Nadder and Wylye, which are tributaries of the River Avon, have been classified with 'poor' overall status.







Loss of biodiversity


Invertebrate species are being lost, with our data identifying steep declines.

The graph shows the decline in annual mean mayfly species richness at Stratford Bridge on the River Avon*.











Where are the problems coming from?

Complex issues – EA say: 43.3% Agriculture 25.4% Sewage

- Increase in new housing development + MoD coming out of Germany 7000 families
- Dairy farming
- MoD sewage treatment works as well as Wessex Water
- Lots of septic tanks in small villages
- Fish farms

Death by a million cuts for our rivers!

Environment Agency have constrained resources and struggle to respond.

Have very few farm inspectors.

Cannot effectively monitor, analyse or enforce standards.

Data from our SmartRivers hub is the same/better currency as the EA. Long term data drives EA to action!
